Questions for Discussion/Application:

- Consider taking time to read Romans 10:9-10 out loud. What initial insights or observations of the text do you have?
- During Holy Week, how did the Lord meet you? How were you encouraged and your eyes drawn to Christ in your personal times with the Lord and/or during our gathering together as a church on Good Friday and Easter?
- Have someone read out loud the lyrics to the hymn "Man of Sorrows"
